
Our Club has recently donated \$100 to 'buy a brick' for the Southland Charity Hospital, I'm sure you will all agree this is a very worthwhile cause.


I look forward to seeing you on Wednesday, 2 September at the Cheeky Llama for our Inner Wheel NZ Walk and Talk Day.

Throw-it-together Self-Crusting Pie

Easy quiche thingy where you throw it all in together, great when you're in a hurry!

4 eggs beaten
1½ cups grated tasty cheese
1 small onion, chopped
6 rashers rindless bacon, chopped (optional)
½ cup self-raising flour
1½ cups milk
¼ cup chopped parsley
Salt and freshly ground black pepper
2 cups of your choice of chopped veges – e.g. mushrooms, peppers, cherry tomatoes, courgettes, corn, peas, beans, grated pumpkin etc.



Preheat oven to 180°C. Spray a medium to large sized lasagne dish with non-stick baking spray. Mix all the ingredients in a bowl. Pour into the prepared dish and bake for 40-45 minutes until set and golden brown.
